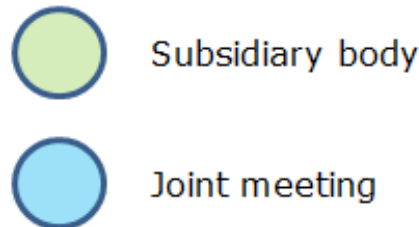
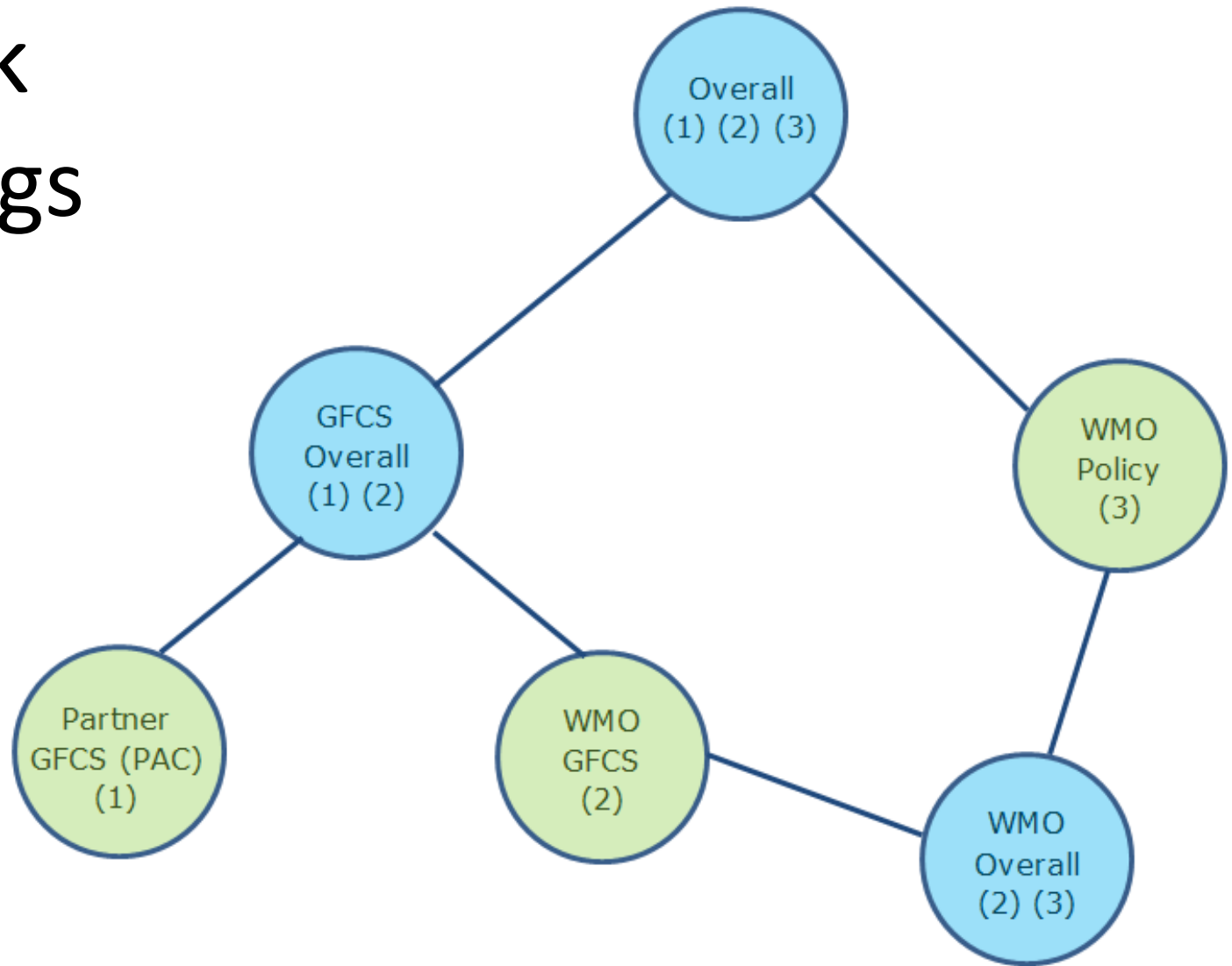


CCP task groupings

Many tasks in the CCP TORs are relevant for sub-categories of CCP membership (green circles):

- 1) Partner contributions to the GFCS
- 2) WMO contributions to the GFCS
- 3) WMO contributions to climate policy



Sub-groups dealing with tasks in these three sub-categories can meet separately or in combination (blue circles)

GFCS-relevant Cg-18 and EC-71 Climate Coordination Panel tasks (1)

- Overall
 - Oversee the implementation of the Global Framework for Climate Services (GFCS), in close cooperation with the GFCS Partners Advisory Committee (PAC)
 - Define the strategy, priorities and objectives for the implementation of the Global Framework for Climate Services (GFCS) through the GFCS implementation plan, including its targets, and periodically update it, as required, and guide and monitor implementation;
 - Submit proposals to EC-72 on mechanisms to enhance the visibility, effectiveness and implementation of the GFCS, including the feasibility of co-sponsorship of the GFCS
 - Coordinate and facilitate the integration of WMO Members' and partners' input into WMO and GFCS flagship products
 - Coordinate and facilitate the sharing of knowledge and information on the implementation of climate services across countries, regions and partner organizations



GFCS-relevant Cg-18 and EC-71 Climate Coordination Panel tasks (2)

- Value chain operationalization
 - Coordinate the collection and development of requirements for climate information, products and services, and for underpinning research, across priority sectors and partner organizations, and WMO contributions to addressing such requirements
 - Identify WMO Member priorities for climate services, NMS and NHS priorities and needs, and those of relevant partner activities and programmes
 - Facilitate a full value chain country-level delivery of climate services to priority climate-sensitive sectors and documentation of associated socioeconomic benefits, in cooperation with development partner organizations
 - Provide guidance for the development of climate services-related projects and ensure coordination of WMO contributions to such projects, in close coordination with GFCS partner organizations in the case of GFCS-related activities



GFCS-relevant Cg-18 and EC-71 Climate Coordination Panel tasks (3)

- Institutional cooperation
 - Facilitate coordination among the NMHSs, Regional Climate Centres, Regional Economic Communities, and other regional entities (such as regional development banks and United Nations organization regional offices), for the development and implementation of the GFCS at the regional and national levels, as well as the associated plans for climate services, to identify regional needs, priorities and gaps, and contribute to regional sector-specific user interface and policy platforms to co-develop products meeting user needs, evaluate the quality and usefulness of the services provided, and obtain and act on user feedback
 - Facilitate and develop the synergy among the Global Framework for Climate Services (GFCS), Regional Frameworks for Climate Services and National Frameworks for Climate Services so as to ensure uniform implementation of the GFCS



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GFCS-relevant Cg-18 and EC-71 Climate Coordination Panel tasks (4)

- Priority tasks
 - Partnership and inclusion – coordination of initiatives and communication regarding climate services in all GFCS priority areas; knowledge sharing with key partners and stakeholders, including private sector; presence at relevant climate events such as sessions of the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the UNFCCC to coordinate and strengthen climate services worldwide; global/regional platforms for climate services,
 - Technical coordination support – identification of capacity development needs for the provision of climate services, applications and climate information; support to Members in climate services implementation through advisory services; identify unmet needs for standards and promote adherence to standards and recommended practices for climate services through the Technical Commission and other bodies for Application and Services and appropriate standard setting-entities or partner organizations,
 - Monitoring and review – improving monitoring and regular assessments of service delivery at global, regional and national scales and publishing a “State of climate services” report regularly,
 - Resource mobilization – promote, enable, articulate and facilitate countries’ and regions’ access to climate finance; strengthen rationale for climate services related proposals both in relation to mitigation and adaptation;

 2. GFCS PAC (Geneva, 28 Nov 2019)
 - Membership and CCP representation
 - Main strategic contributions and directions (for draft TORs)
 3. WMO GFCS mechanism (Geneva, 23 Apr 2020 TBC)
 - Project for roll-out of Climate Services Information System operationalization on sub-regional scales (initial focus on objective seasonal forecast systems and associated tailored products)
 - CMIP 6 and CORDEX operationalization (Resolution 67, Cg-18)
 - Member climate services capacity verification mechanism
- Finalization of membership (Q3 2020 after EC-72)
- 1st CCP overall session (Q3 2020)
 - Review and consolidation of above with next steps
