

Topics on which the PAC could focus its actions during the period 2020 -2023

- Systematic assessment of socio-economic benefits of climate services
 - Serve as a platform for engagement, high-level strategic discussions across pillars and sectors to enable leveraging of efforts to help overcome fragmentation of implementation of activities at global, regional and national levels
 - Identification of existing or planned projects/proposals of partners that could be linked or brought together to enhance connections between the development of climate services and users
 - Promotion of methods, training, tools, initiatives and projects that focus on how climate services can inform decision-making and enable early action in communities exposed to climate risks
 - Development of flagship products such as the State of the Climate Services Report and the Regional Climate Statement on the State of the Climate
 - Organization of global/regional fora on climate services addressing regional priority themes
 - Exhaustive identification of GFCS-related activities worldwide, in terms of committed resources and assessed achievements
 - Synthesis report on GFCS implementation within the GFCS stakeholders to facilitate identification gaps and priorities to enable effective resource mobilization and increase coordination and synergy among GFCS partners
 - Development of guidance on linking climate services with major processes and agendas, e.g., National Adaptation Plans (NAPs), Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)
 - Promotion of Regional and National Frameworks for Climate Services to enable more cohesion in implementation , monitoring and evaluation at regional and national levels
 - Promote a theory of change for climate services with common goals, impact pathways, targets and indicators to track GFCS outcomes through an appropriate agreed monitoring and evaluation framework
 - Operationalization of the User interfaces and Capacity Development pillars.
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
